Using PSC Student Ambassadors in the Primary School Sport Challenge

The Student Ambassador initiative replaces the Year 6 Student Leader initiative and aims to provide leadership opportunities, specifically for year 6 students with an interest and enthusiasm for sport and physical activity, as well as to support class teachers in promoting and managing the Challenge.

The process for selecting and training student ambassadors will be different for each school, depending on the role the school wishes them to take. It may be appropriate to have the school's sports house captains as the designated PSC student ambassadors to give this existing role some further depth and opportunity for leadership development. Up to 16 student ambassador badges can be provided, depending on school size.



Suggested tasks for student ambassadors include but are not limited to:

- visiting classrooms on a weekly basis (at a time agreed by class teachers) to update each class' physical activity data on the e-Wall Chart (in the PSC Tracker)
- taking responsibility for promoting and publicising the Challenge in the school throughout the ten week period. This might include:
 - **promotion** – making posters, writing newsletter articles, preparing photos and stories for publication on the school website
 - **encouragement** – handing out and collecting sport equipment at lunch times, running small games and activities
 - **recognition** – speaking at school assemblies about participation and acknowledging class successes (remembering that the Challenge is about working together as a class group)

Student Ambassador Logins

Year 6 students designated as PSC student ambassadors in the PSC Tracker can be assigned an individual **username and password**. Their PSC Tracker access is limited so that they can only view and update class e-Wall Charts.

To find student ambassador logins, navigate through the Registration Summary/Details page and find the Student Ambassador section and select **Edit**.
