

CODE OF CONDUCT

Team Members:

As a responsible team member you are required to abide by the Code of Behaviour as outlined. This will assist in ensuring that the team has an enjoyable and successful championship.

Code of Behaviour:

1. As a team member:
 - (a) At all times co-operate with your coach, team mates, and opponents, without them you do not have a competition.
 - (b) Work equally hard for yourself and your team – your team's performance will benefit and so will your own.
 - (c) Compete by the rules and always abide by the referees/umpires or judge's decision.
 - (d) Be a good sport. Encourage fellow team members.
 - (e) Control your temper. Make no criticism, either by word or gesture.
 - (f) At no time consume alcohol, nicotine or any illegal drug.
 - (g) No competitor may alter his/her billet without the consent of the team manager and the championship manager. Penalty is suspension from games for the duration of the championship.
 - (h) Private team functions are not to be organised by team members. Sanctioned NSWCHS/NSWPSSA functions will be advised to billeting families in writing.
2. As a parent/spectator:
 - (a) Encourage participation by children.
 - (b) Provide a positive model for your child to copy and demonstrate appropriate social behaviour.
 - (c) Be courteous in your communication with players, team officials, game officials and sport administrators.
 - (d) Let officials conduct events without interference. If there is a disagreement, follow the appropriate and correct procedure in order to question the decision and teach children to do likewise.
 - (e) Encourage and support honest effort, skilled performance and team play with generous applause.
 - (f) Demonstrate respect for opposing players and their supporters without them there would be no game.
 - (g) Recognise the value of volunteer coaches and officials. They give their time and resources to provide recreational activities for the children and deserve your support.
