

Thinking while Moving - English

Boggle

Activity set-up

Draw the 3x3 grid shown in the activity set up diagram on the ground using chalk.

How to play

The **aim** of boggle is to find, hop to spell and record as many CVC words as you can.

What do you need to do?

- Use an underarm throw to throw one of your small objects at a letter in the top row of the grid
- Say the sound out loud.
- Throw another of your small objects at a vowel in the middle row.
- Say the sound of the first letter and then the vowel sound.
- Ask yourself “What sound from the third row do I need to make a word?”
- Throw your last small object at a letter in the third row to make a word.
- Say the word you made. Write it on a piece of paper.

Variations to challenge

- How many words can you make using the letters in the grid? Hop on each letter and say the sounds to make a word as you go. Record the words you make.
- Stand closer or further away when throwing your small object.
- Use an overarm throw to throw the small objects in the grid.
- Make a 5 x 5 grid with letters to find, make and write words.

What do you need?

chalk
pencil and paper
3 small objects to throw – small fluffy toys, pegs, rolled up socks.
